



Supervisor Ron Roberts (San Diego County: District 4)

Ron Roberts was first elected to the Board of Supervisors in 1994 and has served as the Supervisor of District 4 ever since. He is a registered Republican, although by law, county government officials are technically nonpartisan.

Jacob attended SDSU, where he received his BA in Social Sciences, and continued on to UC Berkeley, where he received his Master's in Architecture. He was a managing partner of an architecture firm until 1987, when he was elected to the San Diego City Council. He served on the City Council and the San Diego Planning Commission until his election to the Board of Supervisors.

Given that District 4 encompasses much of the City of San Diego, Roberts has focused on a wide variety of issues during his Board tenure, including foster youth, public safety, senior citizen care, the growing regional economy, and environmental issues. Roberts currently is also a member of the California EPA Air Resources Board, the San Diego Workforce Partnership, the Metropolitan Transit System, and the City-County Reinvestment Task Force.

Due to term limits voted into law in 2010, this is Roberts' final term.
