


Georgette Gómez is the current Councilmember representing San Diego's District 9. Elected in 2016 to District 9's open seat, Gómez lives in City Heights with her partner. She is a registered Democrat, although by law, city government officials are technically nonpartisan.


Gómez was born in San Diego to immigrant parents and grew up in Barrio Logan. She attended San Diego State University and earned her BA in Environmental and Natural Resource Geography. She first served on several neighborhood planning commissions before being elected to office. During her time on the City Council, she has focused on social and environmental justice for San Diego's largest Latino neighborhood.

Gómez is the Chair of the Audit Committee, Vice Chair of the Select Committee on Homelessness, and a member of the Smart Growth and Land Use, Infrastructure, and Budget and Government Efficiency Committees.
